INFORMATION SPECIFIC TO CPEDI2*/3*

Veterinary Regulations for horses participating in FEI-sanctioned competitions were updated as of January 1st 2026. Riders MUST make themselves aware of these updates. Sanctions for noncompliance came into effect from September 1st, 2026. Horses entered in the CPEDI 2*/3* are required to take part in the Horse Health Arrival Inspection. Thursday the Fei Vet will come to stables starting at 12:00pm

Horse Inspection Para Horse Inspection –16:00pm The time draw will be posted online and at the Events office.

FEI registration: All horses and riders taking part in the CPEDI competitions must be registered on the FEI database. If your

registration and papers are not in order, you will not be entered into the FEI system and therefore not able to start at the event. CPEDI competitors need to be aware that ALL Vets attending horses in competitions must hold an FEI Recognition Card. Equine Therapists & Supportive therapies: The FEI Veterinarian Delegate must approve all types of supportive therapies.

NEW FEI HORSE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS As of 1 January 2023

ALL Horses competing at ALL FEI Events must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Stabling: All booked through Boneo Park

Camping: Campsites will be allocated, please camp in your allocated site. Any cars, floats or trucks who have not booked a campsite will be removed. Please note, no horses are allowed in the campsite area.

Dogs: Must be kept on a lead and away from stables and competition arenas.

Bridle Numbers: These are the responsibility of the rider. Bridle numbers must be worn whenever a horse is out of the stable, eg when grazing or training. Competitors grazing horses must take extreme caution, any unsettled horses causing disruption to other horses may be asked to return to the stables.

Please do not lead horses near the arenas whilst competition is taking place.

(Please note all bridle numbers will be allocated to you for this event see acceptance list attached for Bridle number)
