PLEASE NOTE

Goods in kind may replace prize money in some competitions.

Para Dressage break up of prize money paid will depend on entries per competition, Refer FEI Schedule for breakdown.

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money announced for the competition. Distribution of prize money: distributed to 25 % of participants.

If there are between 5 and 19 athletes in the competition, min 5 prizes must be distributed.

If there are 4 or less athletes in the competition, the table below applies.

Prize money: CPEDI, the Organising Committee reserves the right to review and adjust the prize money allocation and amounts for competitions, specifically in competitions with less than 10 entries. As a guide, if a competition has up to 3 entries, prize money will be paid to 1st place, competitions with 4 entries, prize money will be paid to 1st & 2nd place, competitions with 5 entries, prize money will be paid to 3rd place: competitions with 6 entries prize money will be paid to 4th place, 7 to 10 entries, prize money will be paid to 5th place, competitions with 11 or more entries prizes money will be paid to 6th place.

DRESSAGE TESTS

The Equestrian Australia 2023 Dressage tests will be used for all EA events.

For all Pony and Open Championships the .2 and .3 Tests will be used. FEI Competitions: Available on the FEI website <http://www.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/dressage/tests>

ELIGIBILITY AND ACCEPTANCE

All riders must be current Competitive EA members and horses must be EA registered and hold a current competition license

A maximum of 35 combinations will be accepted at each level. For classes which don't require performance qualification, entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis until the class is fully subscribed. Subsequent entries will be placed on a reserve list. .

Para-Equestrian: Open to all FEI registered para equestrian riders, riders may compete from the beginning of the year in which they reach the age of 14.

Small Tour, Medium Tour & Intermediate II CDN: No performances required **EA Preliminary – Advanced Championship Classes:** No performances required

The Organising Committee has discretion to make exceptions in special circumstances to accept certain combinations in consultation with the EADC and Selectors.

Freestyles

CPEDI3* - CPEDI2* – A horse must obtain a minimum score of 60% in Qualifying A & B tests
Virtus must obtain a minimum score of 60% in Qualifying tests A & B –

CPEDI Entry Requirements

Riders may participate under the jurisdiction of the country of which the rider holds his/her passport Riders may ride more than one horse as per the FEI Schedule.

CPEDI Riders must be FEI Classified and EA Para Riders must be minimum EA Classified. Note: all riders must be competitive members of EA: All riders and horses participating in FEI events must be registered on the FEI database. Registrations must be renewed each calendar year. EA collects the charges on behalf of the FEI. Registration forms are available on the EA web site. www.equestrian.org.au or contact the National Office. Please note that this registration is required even if the horse has an FEI Passport or EA National Identification Document.

FEI Horse Health requirements: All horses competing in the CDEDI Events must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI Horse App. Competitors, grooms and owners all need to be aware of the Horse Health Requirements. Start taking your horse's temperature at least 3 days prior to the start of the event <https://inside.fei.org/fei/horse-health/requirements#horse-health-requirements-for-athletes--grooms>

Advertising and Publicity on competitors and horses (FEI Gen. Regs. Art. 135.1-2): The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135.1-2. Riders with privately organised sponsorship may display a "logo" of their sponsor on their saddlecloth. The area covered by this logo may not exceed 200 sq. cm. A sponsor's label on jackets must not exceed 80 sq. cm at the height of breast pockets. Please note that if more than one

sponsor logo is placed on the saddlecloth, the area covered by all logos may not exceed 200 sq. cm as above. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 135 of the EA and FEI General Regulations.

Liability: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted will undertake to indemnify the Organizing Body against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Organizing Body by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any rider, trainer or attendant whilst he is attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agrees that act or omission on the part of such rider or attendant found in any action against the Organizing Body to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity.

Entry refunds: Prior to the close of entries a full refund less the administration fee will be given for scratching's. After the close of entries, 50% of the entry fee will be refunded on receipt of a doctor's or vet certificate submitted to the **Event Secretary within 7 days of the event start date**. OTHER/GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Callers:** No test may be commanded. Without a current EA exemption.
- **Dogs** – Boneo Park is a Wildlife Sanctuary so dogs must be always on a leash. No dangerous dogs please.
- **Speed limits** must be always adhered to.
- **Only designated parking areas can be used.**
- **Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and are supervised.**
- **Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone subsequently riding.**
- **Smoking is prohibited in the stable area.**
- **Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision, at all times.**
- **Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive.**
- **Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways.**
- **Please be aware that all fences are electric.**
- **Exercise and Warm-up Area:** Outdoor warm-up arenas are available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the entry confirmation sent to riders.

Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to

be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to electronically sign the Declaration form included in the entry section.

Indemnity: Neither the Organising Committee (CPH Pty Ltd), Equestrian Australia, Boneo Park, , accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, grooms, owners, ground spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. All competitors, in entering, undertake to accept this regulation.

Medication Control: Horses: Random swabbing will take place in accordance with the Equestrian Australia Medication Control Policy and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations. FEI-sanctioned classes may be tested in line with the FEI Global Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Programme.

Insurances: The OC (CPH) has public liability insurance through Affinity Insurance; competitors have some personal accident and public liability insurance as part of their membership of Equestrian Australia.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. All riders are advised to belong to a private health fund.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

Boneo Park Code of Conduct: The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies. Management at Boneo Park can use discretion at any point in time to determine access to the facilities and are not limited to the code below. Insurance: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

A person must not do any of the following whilst at Boneo Park

- Use indecent, obscene, insulting, or threatening language.
- Behave in an offensive or indecent manner.
- Cause serious alarm or affront to a person by disorderly or unsafe conduct.
- Obstruct a person in the performance of that person's work or duties.
- Boneo Park management do not tolerate the use, transferring or in possession of any non-prescribed illegal drug will be ejected and may be handed over to the police
